Social Determinants of Behavioral Health

It is well established that *place* matters with respect to health and health outcomes. The field of health equity research studies the context where people live, work, and play - i.e., where they *experience* health. Health equity research examines how the environment shapes and influences opportunities for optimal/sub-optimal health and considers related structural and policy interventions to address both built and social environments. Dr. Furr-Holden will provide examples of innovative environmental assessment methods that offer policy-relevant approaches to address the environment and environmental risk. In particular, highlighting policy-based research and implementation efforts in Flint, Michigan and the larger Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Region 5.
